Cyber Safety



Students recently experienced a Cyber Safety session with Senior Constable Andrew Moreton and Senior Constable Loretta Failla. The sessions were interactive and filled with important information to keep them safe online.

Key messages included:

- If you haven't met them in person, they are not your friend as not everyone online is who they say they are
- Set your accounts to private otherwise anyone can see what you are doing
- Only have usernames that doesn't give away your name, age or where you live
- Only share photos with trusted friends that you have met in person
- Be careful what you share online as others can use this to become your friend
- Once you send something online, it cannot be deleted as its stored in the iCloud & you don't know where it can end up
- Red flag questions are not just 'where do you live?' they can also appear to be innocent questions like 'do you like sport or music'? If you have not met them in person, they are not your friend, even if you think someone else you know knows them
- Only play against the computer or trusted friends you have met in person
- It's ok to say 'no' and ask a trusted adult for help
- Only watch age appropriate material online otherwise it can upset you

On Wednesday 20 November at 7pm in the MacKillop Room, we will be delivering a parent session. Information discussed will include:

- providing information on what young people SEE, SAY and DO online, challenges they might face and how to get help if something goes wrong.
- highlighting and promoting safe and responsible online behaviours.
- empowering adults with the tools to be confident in managing the challenges associated with technology use.
- focusing on the challenges that can impact online safety for young people, as well as providing tools to take action
- *And opportunity for questions*

This evening is for all parents no matter what age their child/children may be as it is never too early to arm yourself with the right knowledge and tools.

The evening is **not for students** as it will contain explicit information for adults.

We are currently looking into whether or not we are able to stream the session live online but encourage you to attend onsite.
