2024 Reflection

It is hard to believe I am writing the final newsletter for the year. This year has been a big one on many levels, both personally and collectively. Leadership is an integral part of the success of any organisation, an unexpected change in leadership can be fraught with a sense of uncertainty and instability. We, the St Anthony's School Community, were faced with this challenge very early in the school year and it is wonderful to report that in my opinion we have not only survived but continued to thrive and flourish. Our MACSSIS data supports this and will be shared with the community early next year, once presented to the School Advisory Council.

While 2024 has been a year of forced change, rather than being seen as an obstacle, it has been embraced as an opportunity to reflect and review, resulting in new initiatives and ways of operating. Throughout the year there have been too many successes to list, a few standouts include: The Twilight Fair, Easter Bonnet Parade and Raffle, Toy Camp School Concert, St Anthony's Feast Day Mass and celebration, Sacraments and prayer services, establishing a new School Advisory Council for 2025, Social Justice Outreach and Christmas Carols Evening. Considered time, effort and planning has gone into strengthening links with local kinders and childcare centres. This has involved visits of us to them and them to us, playgroups for preschoolers and the introduction of Story Time.

Strategic planning for 2025 is in place. A continued strength is the stability and experience of our staff. Next year we retain all bar one ongoing staff member, Leena Trigila, who is retiring. Leena is a much loved and gifted Visual Arts teacher, as I expressed at the Gratitude Mass we have been all the better for having had her with us. We thank her for sharing her gifts with us and wish her well in her future endeavours. We have a number of staff taking LSL next year and current staff will be covering this leave, providing consistency for our students and programs. The work undertaken on explicit instruction will embed in literacy and mathematics and move into other curriculum areas. An enrollment strategy which began this year, will continue to further develop. This will be the agenda at our Parent Forum in Term 1. It is, and will continue to be, a collaborative approach.

I am grateful to have worked and led alongside our school community. Our students bring Christ to life through their words and actions, the St Anthony's Seven Attributes are visible in their academic and social emotional learning. They have not only strived for their own personal best but also encouraged others to do the same. They are a credit to themselves, their parents and teachers.

Our staff, which includes teachers, learning support officers and administration, have risen above and beyond this year. They have worked with commitment, dedication, collaboration and a true desire to raise the bar on what can be achieved. They have modelled the attributes of lifelong learning, through their knowledge development and practice. They have led by example.

Finally I acknowledge and thank the Parish Staff, in particular Fr Shabin, for his support of me in the Acting Principal role. This gratitude extends to the staff and school community. I have been blessed to have been afforded not only the opportunity but to have been able to do so with the encouragement, support and trust of others.

Wishing everyone a blessed and peace filled Christmas season. Tread gently through what all too often becomes a busy and stressful time, finding quiet moments for prayer, reflection and rejuvenation. May the hope and joy experienced through the baby Jesus extend into the coming Jubilee year.


The school fair is most surely on the top of my list for sure.




